Resolution on The Starvation Funding

The Effects of Book Boycotts

WHEREAS, the American Association of Publishers (AAP) has requested that the American Library Association endorse The Starvation of Young Black People, the effects of Book Boycotts in South Africa,

→ WHEREAS, an endorsement of this would be in conflict with ALA Policy 9.4 regarding racist institutions; ALA Policy 9.3 regarding affiliation with organizations which violate human rights and social justice; ALA Policy 53.3, the abridgement of the rights of freedom of foreign nationalities; ALA POLICY 53.4 government intimidation policy, Council resolution 1986, and

WHEREAS, the ending of the ~~boycott~~ of ~~the~~ land and other organizations, the lifting of the National Emergency Act, the lifting of some ~~political~~ prisoner's including Nelson Mandela and Walter Sisulu, the partial lifting of the Separate Amenities Act have not led to a system of apartheid, since elementary human, economic and political rights have not been granted to the black majority population; and

WHEREAS, the foregoing changes are only "the beginning of the process to abolish apartheid, Nelson Mandela has urged the nations of the world to continue to support the struggle. Sisulu advises that there are clear, visible signs that there is an end to apartheid; the pressure must continue and

WHEREAS, at ~~a~~ ~~near~~ ~~recent~~ ~~meeting~~, the overwhelming majority of ALA members applauded the recent changes initiated by President F.W. deKlerk but went on record strongly supporting the continuation of the boycott against South Africa until apartheid is completely dismantled; and

WHEREAS, South African librarians colleagues at the forefront of the anti-Apartheid and anti-censorship struggle have called upon us to uphold the boycott, urging that we continue to do all those committed to democracy in South Africa while confirming to our international partners the continuation of apartheid through military, commercial, financial and other means; and

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that we do not support the AAP Resolution and not endorse the AAP Report.
