Resolution on Damage and Destruction of Schools and Cultural Institutions in Gaza and Damage to Israeli Schools

- Whereasthe American Library Association (ALA) deplores the destruction of libraries, library collections, and property, and the disruption of educational process by that act, whether it be done by individuals or groups of individuals, and whether it be done in the name of honest dissent, the desire to control or limit thought or ideas, or for any other purpose (ALA Policy. B.8);1
- Whereas on June 19, 2002 ALA Council passibilities on the Destruction of Palestinian Libraries, Archives, and other Cultural Institution (SD#18.8 of 2002002), in which the ALAdeplored the destruction of Palestinian libraries and cultural resourines pring of 2002, and alled "upon the government of the United States, as well as other governments, intergovernmental organizations and nongovernmental reading anizations to prevent further destruction of libraries and cultural resources and to provide material assistance for the reconstruction and restoration of these resources";
- Whereason January 28, 2009 ALA Council passe@Resolution on the ConnectioBetween the Recent Gaza Conflict and Librarie(SD#18.1 of 2002009) in which the American Library Association called for the protection of libraries and archives in Gaza and Israel and and archives in Gaza and Israel and archives the US Government to support the United States Committee
